As you can see, income and funds are massively down on last year, as a result of Covid 19.

Fortunately, members' subs have held up and should be very similar to last year by the end of 2020. We donated £38,000 to Chapter in April/May to help with their desperate financial position. This has reduced our funds to £10,783, but holding this amount enables us to comply with our constitution which dictates that we should maintain a minimum contingency of £10,000. Let's hope for a better year in 2021.
