

# Treasurer's Report – Year ended 31st.December 2021

## **Income**

Income is down on last year because of the reduction in legacies and donations. Income for both 2021 and 2020 was well down on previous years because of Covid.

Subscriptions have held up against 2020 and previous years. Fund Raising income was similar to last year but was down on previous years because of Covid.

# **Expenditure**

We have made big savings by not issuing an Autumn report this year and sending the AGM report mainly by e mail.

# **Grants to Chapter**

There have been no grants to Chapter this year (2021) as our funds were greatly reduced last year (2020) with our payment of £38K to Chapter at the start of lockdown.

Hopefully as our funds start to pick up in 2022, we will be in a better position to recommence our grant giving. In fact we have already paid £2.6K for the specialised floor cleaner for the new toilets.

# **Summary**

It looks like things are improving with Covid and hopefully we can get back to a more normal situation in 2022 with increased financial support for Chapter.

# Minutes of Friends of Truro Cathedral AGM 25/07/2021

- 1. Opening Prayer
- Apologies for Absence: Very Rev. David & Mrs Jean Shearlock, Martin Saunders, Mary Pett, Jenny Tippett, Mr and Mrs Werry, Daphne Skinnard, Roberta Evans, Pauline Sansom, Charles Butchart, Michael Tedder, Ivor & Jennifer Hicks
- 3. Minutes of AGM 2019 were passed without amendment.
- There were no Matters Arising.
- 5. Presidents Address: The President, Dean Roger Bush addressed the Meeting. He referred to the pandemic challenge of

the last year and the importance of the Cathedral representing the presence of God in the midst of all the stress and

anxiety. As restrictions lifted and people could come together in worship there was a feeling of tensions being released.

So many people had also come to the Cathedral during especially hard times to find and receive individual comfort.

Later in the Meeting the Dean was joined by Sean O'Neill, Chief Operations Officer, who told of some success by the

Fundraising staff in obtaining Grants for various projects including the roof especially over St. Mary's aisle. However

£80,000 would still need to be raised to meet with match funding requirements.

The Dean was also looking to progress his special project to replace the Cathedral chairs. Samples of possible

replacements were outside the vergers office and he would welcome feedback.

- 6 Questions were asked including ways to make the Cathedral more "accessible" to younger people. We were told this was already in discussion with possible partners.
- Treasurer's Accounts. The Treasurer presented the accounts for the financial year 2020 which had been rather quiet due to the Covid Restrictions. We had made a substantial gift of £38,000 to the Chapter to help with payment of salaries and general expenses. This was as much as we could give at the time and kept us in line with our Financial Policy limits. Subscriptions had held up and we had received a very generous, anonymous donation of £900.
- 8. The Dean proposed acceptance of the accounts which were passed unanimously. Canon Paul Arthur as Independent Examiner was also confirmed unanimously by the Meeting.
- 9. Election of Officers: There was one retiring member of Council, Ian Hare. Thanks were given to Ian, for the hard, unstinting, work he had done throughout his 6 year term.
